If you live in a pre-1978 home,  
your home may have lead hazards.

HELP IS AVAILABLE TO YOU!







You qualify for help if you meet the following requirements:

- Your household income is within the low-to-moderate income limits (see income table to the right)
- You live in a one to four unit residential home built before 1978
- The property is structurally sound

## Everything is Free

- Preliminary lead testing to determine if lead is present and exposed on painted surfaces
- Lead inspection/risk assessment of your home
- Remediation of lead-based paint hazard via interim controls

**To check your child's lead level, contact your pediatrician**

Lead is often found in the paint in homes built before 1978. Adults and children can get lead into their bodies if they:

- Breathe in lead dust (especially during activities such as renovations, repairs and painting that disturb painted surfaces)
- Swallow lead dust that has settled on food, food preparation surfaces and other places
- Eat paint chips or soil that contain lead.
- Drink water from the tap with old plumbing
- Eat certain food or spices, or touch certain toys or pottery that contain lead

Why? Because their bodies easily absorb lead and they often put things into their mouths.

Or, they may be confused with signs of other illnesses, like the flu. Warning signs of lead poisoning may include:

- stomach pains, constipation, frequent vomiting or poor appetite
- sleep problems, irritability, tiredness or headache
